Assessment:

With ongoing research, the term "Management Consultant" has proven to be a broad classification that in truth encompasses a very diverse range of specializations and opportunities in consulting. My research has made me aware of the various paths in

management consulting that peak my interest and that I can pursue through a consistent course of action.

I have previously been narrow minded in my understanding of management consulting, and believed that one must be involved in only business, information technology, or finance if wanting to become a management consultant. Although knowledge of business and finance are necessary, a management consultant can be involved in a wide range of subjects such as marketing consulting, environmental consulting, and human resources consulting. One specification in consulting that intrigued me was operations consulting, which encompassed my interest of cost management. An operations consultant is tasked mainly with outsourcing, process management, supply chain management, and gaining assets. This means that the operations consultant for example must calculate the least expensive option for a company that is attempting to establish a building in a new location, or a business that is seeking to reduce costs in the production and distribution of an item.

Another consulting career path that is more specialized and garnered my attention was strategy consulting, due to its key role in a company's future success. Strategy consultants are entrusted with creating a long term vision, purchasing new assets or discontinuing certain aspects of a company, and deciding where and when to distribute resources, which are all decisions that can have big ramifications if all the factors are not properly accounted for. Becoming a strategy consultant would require me to be a decisive individual that is able to collect all the necessary information about a company that will influence its future well-being and success. This discovery has changed my perception that management
